Information to be provided in advance by fishing vessels requesting permission to enter in the port of Papeete

Only the port of Papeete is accessible to fishing vessels sailing internationally. Derogations are possible in compliance with France's international commitments (Safety at sea, maritime assistance, medical,...). This document must be transmitted 96h before arrival at the dock or at the latest 3h before entry into the Polynesian EEZ.

As of October 5, 2017 (French Polynesia Environment Code, art LP2211-3), all species of shark are protected under local law. Thus, the following are prohibited for all species of shark:

- fishing, mutilation, and
- whether alive or dead, transport, use, possession, offering for sale, sale or purchase, import or export.

Any breach of this article's provisions is punishable by two year's imprisonment and a fine of 17.800.000 CFP (~150.000€)
